From January, 2004, through April, 2004, diploma and associate degree graduates obtaining degrees from 7/1/02 through 6/30/03 were surveyed by the Institutional Development Division. The survey consisted of two mailings followed by a telephone interview of nonrespondents. One question asked graduates for suggestions for improving Tri-County Technical College. A total of 491 graduates were surveyed and 77 or 16% provided suggestions. The following lists their responses to the question.

# Arts and Sciences Graduates

# Associate in Arts and Associate in Science - 52 Graduates Surveyed

- You are doing a good job.
- Have more people that deal with the students one-on-one.
- More windows in classrooms, alumni parking, or transform parking lots into classrooms.
- Advisors should help students understand what classes transfer.
- Add an automotive program. Greenville Technical College has one, and you are losing students to them that could attend here.
- More parking for students only.
- Don't get too caught up in the online classes and trendy new stuff. Tri-County Technical College's best asset is the people, especially the faculty. Keep using that asset to the maximum.

# **Business and Human Services Graduates**

#### **Summary Statement**

Of the 491 graduates surveyed, 77 or 16% provided suggestions for improving Tri-County Technical College. The top five suggestions from highest to lowest frequency of response were (1) addressing parking concerns, (2) increasing availability of courses (3) updating and maintaining equipment and facilities, (4) improving availability and effectiveness of advisors and instructors, and (5) offering more social interaction for students.
