2007-2008 SUGGESTIONS
FOR IMPROVING
STUDENT RETENTION
FROM STUDENTS
[March, 2008]



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On October 22, 2007, and October 23, 2007, students in Arts and Sciences, Business and Public Services, Comprehensive Studies, Health Education, and Industrial and Engineering Technology were surveyed during 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. classes. The students were asked to respond to the following question: What can Tri-County Technical College do to better assist students in completing their programs of study and graduating from Tri-County Technical College? A total of one thousand five hundred and nine students were surveyed. The following lists their responses to the question for 2007-2008.

Suggestions from Arts and Sciences Students

- Open more classes.
- More open computer labs.
- Satellite campuses are a big help, especially to those of us who work fulltime and go to school fulltime and have kids.
- Offer classes at different variety of times.
- Have more money for people who need it.
- Cost not so high.
- Offer more classes so they don't fill up quickly.
- Make sure the advisors know which classes students to take to be on the right track to graduating.
- Make the classes cost less, have more open classes make classes less confusing to choose what we need.
- Have more online classes available.
- Offer assistance to single moms who work and go to school, (maybe with gas or books that financial aid doesn't cover).
- Offer more classes at more times.
- Offer childcare services! Become more involved maybe with local companies as far as job securities and job stability while in school.
- I think financial aid should be based on student's income. My parents have money, but I am paying my way through college, which is very hard.
- Definitely childcare.
- Allow students to make up classes when needed.

- Cheaper books.
- Offer more online classes. Get the CAT bus to run longer hours like 9 p.m.
- Better advising.

- Make sure students are enrolled in the correct courses.

The remaining 11% were unrelated suggestions.

2006-2007 Student Survey Summary Results: Approximately 41% of the comments requested improved class offerings, 14% addressed increasing financial aid, 10% covered better advising, 6% covered better instruction, 7% desired childcare services, 5% addressed communication problems, 4% addressed tutoring, 3% covered better transportation, and 2% addressed information technology issues. The remaining 8% were unrelated suggestions.

2007-2008 Student Survey Summary Results: Approximately 24% of the comments requested improved class offerings, 19% covered better advising,14% addressed increasing financial aid, 11% desired childcare services, 6% addressed facility issues 7% covered better instruction, 7% addressed communication problems, 3% addressed tutoring, 3% addressed allowed absences, and 2% covered better transportation. The remaining 4% were unrelated suggestions.
